The Disclosure and Barring Service (**DBS**) helps employers make safer recruitment decisions and prevent unsuitable people from working with vulnerable groups, including children.

The **update service** is an online subscription service that lets you keep your DBS certificates up to date and allows employers to check a certificate online, with your consent. You can use your certificate again when you apply for a position in the same workforce, where the same type and level of check is required. Registration lasts for one year and costs £13 a year and starts from the date your DBS certificate was issued.

Common Core Skills training covers the following 6 key core skills areas: Effective communication skills, Child & young person development, Safe guarding, managing transitions, multi agency team working and information sharing. It provides an understanding of key common values, that promote respect, diversity and a positive environment for all children to thrive.

Ofsted will accept a formal recognised childcare qualification, level 2 +.

Ofsted compliant 12 hour Paediatric First Aid is a comprehensive course typically spread over 2 days practical training. Certificates are valid for 3 years.

Public Liability Insurance protects nannies should anything happen to the children whilst they are in their care.

Insurance is valid for a year.
